

Task 4.1 Spain - Exploring cooperation mode

Performing a survey about the cooperation possibilities: the research topics, the funding modes, cooperation mechanisms

Result:

Significant interest in launching common calls

9 partners are willing to cooperate within NET-HERITAGE

12 partners within a continuation after NET-HERITAGE

Real common pot is not acceptable for majority of partners.

Virtual mode preferred









Task 4.1 Spain - Exploring cooperation mode

Agreement on the priority of 4 research topics:

- Environmental assessment and monitoring
 - Investigation of damage mechanisms to establish preventive conservation strategies,
- Evaluation of treatments and materials used in conservation at present and over recent decades, assessing their suitability and future consequences
- Tele-survey and Geographic Information systems for protection and management of tangible cultural heritage










- This MoU is structured on the different aspects of the future






